AN EIGHT-MEMBER CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE FORMED

An eight-member Consultative Committee to the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh has been constituted with the following political parties of Bangladesh : the Awami League, NAP (Ehasani), NAP (Muzaffar), the Communist Party of Bangladesh and Bangladesh National Congress.

The leaders of these parties met for two days in Mujibnagar and unanimously decided to form the Committee. The meeting was inaugurated and conducted by the Prime Minister of Bangladesh.

The newly constituted committee will be available to the Government of Bangladesh for consultation on matters relating to the liberation struggle. The members of the Committee are as follows:-

1. Maulana Abdul Hamid Khan Ehasani (Ehasani NAP)
2. Mr. Moni Singh (Communist Party of Bangladesh)
3. Mr. Monoranjan Dhar (Bangladesh National Congress)
4. Professor Muzaffar Ahmed (NAP-Muzaffar)
5. Mr. Tajuddin Ahmed, Prime Minister of Bangladesh
6. Mr. Khandaker Moshtaque Ahmed, Foreign Minister of Bangladesh
7. Two other Members from Awami League

Mr. Tajuddin Ahmed will convene and conduct meetings of the Consultative Committee.

The leaders participating in the Mujibnagar meeting recorded their firm faith in and unflinching support for the Government of Bangladesh in its efforts to carry the liberation struggle to a victorious conclusion. The leaders called upon the people of Bangladesh to remain united and stand solidly behind the Government of Bangladesh, composed of the elected representatives of the people, to bring the day of victory nearer. They called on the freedom loving and struggling people of the world actively to support the liberation struggle of 75 million people of Bangladesh.

The formation of the Committee would ensure a sense of participation in the liberation struggle to all shades of people and opinion who are actively fighting against the colonial and imperialist exploiters in Bangladesh. The formation of the Committee is an expression of the total unity of the rank and file of the freedom loving people of Bangladesh having faith in the leadership of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the Awami League and the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh which alone constitutes legitimacy in Bangladesh.

RESOLUTIONS:

The following resolutions were adopted unanimously in the meeting at Mujibnagar:

1. The meeting expressed its indignation and anguish at the illegal detention of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the acclaimed national leader of Bangladesh by the West Pakistani Army junta. The meeting strongly condemned the shameful attempt to stage a farcical and outrageous trial of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman by the Army rulers of West Pakistan. The meeting called upon all the powers and the U.N. to take immediate steps to halt this atrocious trial and secure the Sheikh's release who is the Head of the independent and sovereign State of Bangladesh.

2. The meeting affirmed its whole-hearted confidence and faith in the Government of Bangladesh and recorded its complete support for it.

3. The meeting called upon India and countries of the world to accord immediate recognition to the Government of Bangladesh and thereby accept the reality of a liberation struggle involving 75 million peace-loving democratic people of Bangladesh. The meeting further called upon the countries of the world to render active assistance including arms and ammunitions to the Government of Bangladesh.

4. The meeting gratefully acknowledged the deeds of heroism of the freedom fighters of Bangladesh who are struggling against overwhelming odds to liberate the country from the clutches of the occupation Army of west Pakistani vested interests. The meeting paid glowing tributes to the brave sons of the soil who courted martyrdom in the act of freeing their country.

5. The meeting expressed its profound gratitude to the people and Government of India for the generous help they have extended to the evacuees of Bangladesh. The meeting further expressed appreciation for the support the Government of India has extended to the struggling people of Bangladesh.

6. The meeting expressed **solidarity** with the people of West Pakistan who are struggling to free themselves from the shackles of exploitation. The meeting made a fervent appeal to the people of West Pakistan to extend full support to the liberation struggle of their brethren in Bangladesh.

7. The meeting resolved that short of full independence no other political proposition in respect of Bangladesh will be ever acceptable to the people of Bangladesh. The people of Bangladesh have made supreme sacrifices to achieve freedom and if blood is price of freedom the unarmed people of Bangladesh are paying it every hour.
